In our institution, we practice the process of Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) rigorously. This includes a series of class tests, question and answer sessions, project works, assignments, seminar representations, etc. The copies of the class tests are thoroughly evaluated and are shown to the students for their reference. We also organize question and answer sessions regularly, so that the students can become aware of their lacunas. After every exam, we discuss the answers with the students for their future reference. To rectify and eradicate doubts, we organize doubt clearance sessions for a comprehensive understanding of the portion after the completion of every topic. We also organize departmental seminars on various to equip our students for higher studies. Here, at Kulti College, we strongly believe that "practice makes a man perfect" thus, we pay utmost importance to the process of CIE. This allows our students to go through a continuous practice that not only prepares them for the university exams but also for the future. Further, based on our evaluation we conduct remedial classes for the weaker students. Francis Bacon has aptly said in his essay "Of Studies" that, "Reading maketh a full man, conference a ready man and writing an exact man". Thus, with the help of the CIE process, we ensure that all these important aspects of knowledge reading, writing and public discourse-are properly taken care of. We believe in the holistic development of our students and with the help of the CIEs, we thrive to make our students ready for tomorrow.
